Bruce P. Elman is a Visiting Professor at University of Toronto Faculty of Law this year and the Centre for the Legal Profession's Visiting Scholar in Residence for 2011-2012. He also was recently appointed as Integrity Commissioner for The City of Windsor.

Professor Elman is currently on leave from his position as a member of the Faculty of Law at the University of Windsor, where he served as Dean of Law from 2000 to 2011. Previously, Professor Elman was Belzberg Professor of Constitutional Law and Chair of the Centre for Constitutional Studies at the Faculty of Law, University of Alberta.

Professor Elman teaches Constitutional Law. He has also taught Criminal Law and Professional Responsibility. He has been Visiting Professor of Law and Canadian Studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem on two occasions, 1988 – 1989 and 1995 – 96. He continues to serve as a member of the Academic Advisory Committee for the Halbert Centre for Canadian Studies at Hebrew University.

He is the Co-editor of Rotman, Elman, and Gall, **Constitutional Law: Cases, Commentary and Principles** (Thomson Carswell – 2008).
